General Rules and Regulations for the Fair

REGISTRATION:

- All entries and entry tags are done by computer. Therefore, it is recommended that all entry forms be mailed or emailed prior to the week of the fair. **There will be someone in the Entry Clerk's office Monday-Friday the week before fair (at the main fair office) to answer questions and make entry tags. (Monday 7/13, Wednesday 7/15, and Friday 7/17: 10am–5pm; Tuesday 7/14: 3pm-6pm; and Thursday 7/16: 10am-4pm.)**
- Exhibitors can also email their filled-out entry forms to floralhallentries@gmail.com with "Floral Hall Entry Form" on the subject line.
- Although you can have entry tags printed prior to the fair, **ALL** exhibits must be brought on the Saturday prior to the fair.
- Those people who pre-register their entries may go directly to Floral Hall on **Saturday** with their exhibits. If you have not received your entry tags, they will be in a file box on the counter in the Fair Office. If you have not paid your entry fees, but sent in your entries, you must pay those fees when you pick up your entry tags. **Those who do not pre-register will have to wait for your entries to be registered and your tags to be issued. Hours to receive tags are 9:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m at the entry clerk's table in front of Maytum Stage at Floral Hall.**
- The entry fee is 10% of the First Place PREMIUM, except in the Junior Departments where there is no fee.
- Only **ONE** entry allowed in any **ONE CLASS!** Please identify the item if entered in "any other"!
- **Each exhibitor paying a minimum entry fee of \$1.00 will be given one poster pass as a courtesy.** Youth exhibitors entering 3 or more items will also receive one poster pass. **Poster passes are not considered General Admission - Pay One Price Tickets.** Poster passes cannot be used to ride rides or enter grandstand events. Extra poster passes cannot be purchased.
- Two weekly passes and one car pass will be allowed for each booth in Floral Hall.

EXHIBITORS:

- **Floral Hall Exhibits are now open to any New York State resident, regardless of county of residence.**
- Entrant must be the maker of exhibit.
- "First time exhibitors" are for first time in that department. Please indicate on Exhibitor Form.
- **NO DEALERS OR PROFESSIONALS PERMITTED TO COMPETE FOR PREMIUM MONEY**
- Any employee receiving compensation from the Chautauqua Agricultural Association is prohibited from competing for any PREMIUM money.
- Age of the Junior exhibitors may be a factor in judging. List age on all junior entry forms.

ENTRIES/ ITEMS/ EXHIBITS:

- All entries/exhibits must be brought to Floral Hall between **9:00am and 5:00pm** on the Saturday prior to the fair, **EXCEPT** for the following departments: Homemade Foods, Agriculture, Fruits, and Flowers, which must be brought in between **8:30-9:30 am** on the Sunday prior to the fair. **Entry tags, however, still need to be made by 4:30 p.m. on Saturday prior to the fair. Exhibits must be in place inside Floral Hall before 5:00 p.m on Entry Saturday. After 5:00 p.m., all exhibits will be turned away.** Entry fees will not be returned for any reason.
- Arrangements for picking up all entries will be on Monday, the day after the Fair ends. **THE HOURS FOR PICK UP ARE 11:00 AM TO 6:00 PM.** You will be picking up your PREMIUM checks on that day as well. Any entries not picked up this day will be held in the fair office until August 31st or will be discarded
- All exhibits must remain on display for the duration of the Fair
- If bringing a large item, notify Superintendent before entering item. (Phone numbers are listed on page 5.)
- We reserve the right to change the classification of any item entered incorrectly. Because this is a family-oriented Fair, the superintendents/directors/clerks reserve the right to reject or refuse any exhibit, and to order the removal of any exhibit which, in the opinion of the superintendents/directors/clerks is not eligible or worthy of showing (soiled/inappropriate), or has not met the entry requirements.
- **No purchased item** may be altered or changed and then entered.
- See specific rules in each department.
- The judge may award more than one second or third if exhibit warrants same. First place is awarded at the judge's discretion. "Best of Show" Rosette will be awarded in each adult department.
- There are **NO** monetary awards given for "Best of Show" recipients.
- **Floral Hall will be open during Fair Week: Monday: 12p-5p; Tuesday – Saturday 10a – 9p; Sunday 12p – 7p.**

Uniformity in size of the specimen on a plate is considered. **All fruits should be labeled with variety, if known.** Awards will not be made on any exhibits, which in the opinion of the judges, do not comply with specifications or, are in other respects, not worthy. **All exhibits in this department must be in place by 9:30 a.m., Sunday, prior to the fair.** They may be brought in Saturday or Sunday. **ENTRIES, HOWEVER, MUST BE MADE SATURDAY. 1. Exhibitors must fill out entry blank with the class number and the name of the entry as they are listed on the schedule. **Entry blanks must be printed by 5:00 pm on the Saturday prior to the fair.**
 2. Flower show entries may be brought in Saturday, but will be fresher for judging if brought in Sunday. **They must be in place by 9:30 am Sunday.**
 3. **When possible, exhibitor is encouraged to provide fresh flowers as necessary during the week. Flower substitutions may be made to keep the display fresh and attractive. Varieties may not match the original entry.**
 4. No exhibit shall be removed before 10:00 am on Monday after the fair. However, any entry may be discarded during fair week if the entry has deteriorated and will be replaced with a photo taken on judging day.
 5. The Flower Show Committee reserves the right to exclude any undesirable exhibit. **No entries taken on items having received a PREMIUM last year.**
 6. Fresh, dried or contrived plant material is to only be used unless otherwise stated. **(No artificial material.)**
 7. Only one entry by an exhibitor allowed in each class, unless different species or color.
 8. Juniors may enter all classes, if they pay the entry fee. There is no entry fee for Junior classes under Department 206
 9. In Horticulture classes, specimen must be in jars or bottles **(which will be furnished by the Flower Show Committee)** - no vases. Include attached foliage. **EXHIBITOR MUST REMOVE LEAVES FROM STEM UNDER WATER LINE.**
 10. No plants in arrangements
 11. **Bring saucers for any potted plants or flowers**
